Recycle Used Motor Oil, Filters & More

The following petroleum products

ARE ACCEPTED and may be put into
the used oil collection tank:

- motor oil:
- hydraulic fluid;
- gear oil;
- diesel fuel;
- fuel oil;
- kerosene:
- automatic transmission fluid; and
- power steering fluid.

The following petroleum products CANNOT BE PLACED in the used oil collection tanks:

- antifreeze:
- Varsol;
- brake fluid;
- paint (oil and latex);
- paint thinner;
- refrigeration oil; and
- any solvent cleaner or substance used to clean paint brushes.

OIL FILTERS MUST BE DRAINED. Allow 24 hours for oil to be completely removed from filter.

Recycle Used Motor Oil!

Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles are frequently improperly disposed of. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water... often the very water we drink.



To make recycling easy and convenient, all Colleton County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles for recycling.

Why Recycle?

- TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES
 - For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, nine gallons of fuel are saved.
 - 58 percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.
- TO SAVE ENERGY
 - Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.
 - Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.
- TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE
 - Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.

APPLIANCES (WHITE GOODS) AND SCRAP METAL	All appliances with metal parts including stoves, washers, dryers, refrigerators, grills and bicycles, etc.	Please ask attendant on duty for instructions.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
BATTERIES, LEAD-ACID)	Used automotive, light truck, marine and lawn mower batteries	Household batteries (alkaline, Ni-Cd) ARE NOT accepted.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
CARDBOARD	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping	Flatten.	Only at Beltline, Hudson Mill, Lodge and Cottageville Recycling Centers
NEWSPAPER AND NSERTS	Dry newspapers and inserts		Only at Beltline and Cottageville Recycling Centers as well as Landfill
USED MOTOR OIL, BOTTLES AND FILTERS	Motor oil from cars and trucks (limit 10 gallons per day)	Transport in a tightly sealed container.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill

ARD DEBRIS	Leaves, tree limbs and shrubs		Only at Beltline and Cottageville Recycling Centers
